New Word Booklet Pick 3-5 interesting or tricky words from the book. Write each word, what it means, and draw a picture.
Book Review Write 2-3 sentences about what you liked or didn't like about the book. Give it a star rating!	Character Feelings Pick one character. Draw them and write or tell how they felt at the beginning, middle, and end.	Problem and Solution What was the problem in the story? How did the character solve it? Draw or write about it.
